TEST Tidbits: Some Positive Environmental News

Easter Season is almost here, spring plants are coming up, and it is good to put the spotlight on some interesting and positive things happening that have to do with our environment. Here are some examples to make your heart glad. They might be small in scale, but added together, they give us a hint at the possibilities.

Internationally: In Australia, an architect has designed a clinic that brings the healing aspects of nature closer to the patients. In their design, they use many natural materials such as wood, rocks, and water to make sure each room has some healing view of nature. In the clinic, there are vertical gardens, ponds with live fish, fountains, sundecks, and atriums. Natural light is a must for each room and patients are encouraged (when able) to visit these natural areas. This design concept aids in the healing of patients along with modern medicine. Nationally: The Climat Solution Caucus is a group of Republicans and Democrats from the U.S. House of Representatives. They began in 2016

under the leadership of Rep. Carlos Curbelo (R-Fla.), and Rep. Ted Deutch (D-Fla.) and aim to explore policies and options that address the causes, challenges, and solutions of our changing climate. Regionally: In Boulder, CO, two newly graduated CU students, Tyler Huggins (Civil Engineering Ph.D.) and Justin Whiteley (Mechanical Engineering Ph.D.), have started a new company called Energy Labs. This company will continue to perfect their prototype battery made from the wastewater from beer production. They grow fungus in the beer production wastewater until it congeals into a jelly. They bake the "jelly" until it makes a charcoal-like substance that is like a raw electrode compatible with existing battery designs. Hopefully, it is a beginning in the process of making the new generation of batteries. Cheers to them! State of Kansas: Brian Garner, spokesperson for wind farm developer [NextEra Energy, Inc.](#), said that he foresees that Kansas will continue to have a strong market for renewable energy, especially in wind energy, in the coming years.

Local News: The Merc, Lawrence's natural grocery store, needs a new roof and needs to update their air-conditioning and heating systems. Fortunately, Cromwell Solar, a local solar energy company, has a terrific solution. The store will have them build a solar array over their roof. The plan also includes a solar-panel-covered patio area and approximately 34 solar-panel-covered parking spaces that will generate electricity. They expect a 25-year payout from their solar upgrade, and it will cover 29% of their energy needs. It will also reduce about 16.5 million pounds of pollution in that time frame. The solar panels will save \$18 million in energy costs! Good for them -- local all the way! Follow the project at www.theMerc.coop/newsletter.

Trinity: Don't forget the Earth Day event in South Park on April 22. Trinity's Environmental Stewardship Team (TEST) and friends will march in the parade and host a booth in the park all day. Trinity Interfaith Food Pantry

The Trinity Interfaith Food Pantry (TIFP) was open eight days in March 2017 and served 212 families (175 children, 372 adults), 251 senior adults, and 23 new patrons requesting food assistance. The total expense in March for food purchased locally and through Harvesters was \$1,128.55; and the total retail value of all food provided (both donated and purchased) was \$4,189.12. TIFP is grateful for all donations of money and food to provide food assistance to many people in Douglas County. This month, TIFP will be one of several food pantries to receive donations from the annual Boy Scout Food Drive on April 8. Also, this month the Harvesters Mobile Food Distribution will take place on Saturday, April 22, at First Baptist Church (1330 Kasold).

GIFT Cards: A Good Deal

Grocery Income for Trinity (GIFT) cards for all the Lawrence grocery stores are always available for sale in the parish hall between church services. A GIFT card you buy at church is treated like cash at the store: a \$50 card buys \$50 worth of groceries. And it results in a contribution to the church, because these grocers have agreed to give back to Trinity between 4% and 6% of the total amount that you spend with that store's GIFT card. It is an easy way to contribute to Trinity.
